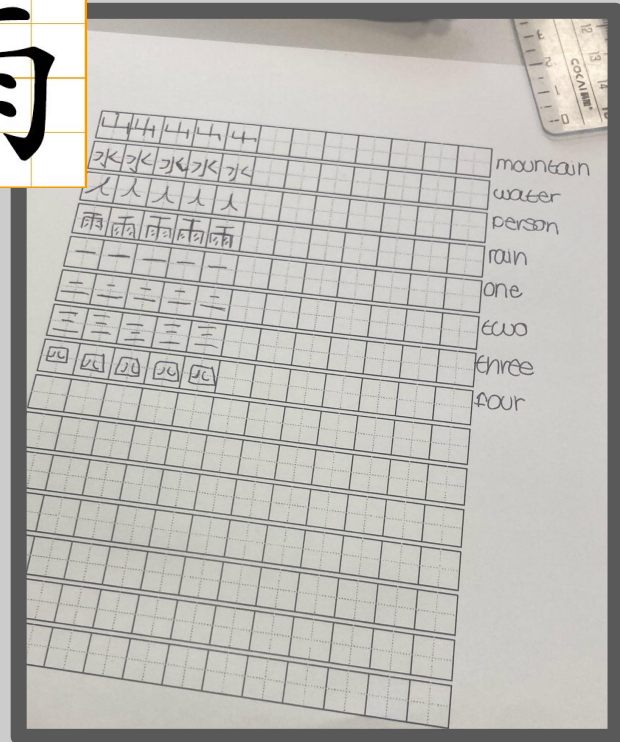

Students were able to practise Hanzi characters, as well as engage in a spoken dialogue.

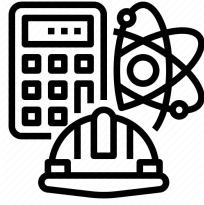

Basketball

The Flexi-League team continue to fight for top spot in their league with a handful of games left. Our most recent visit to Rotherham United saw us come out 2-1 winners.





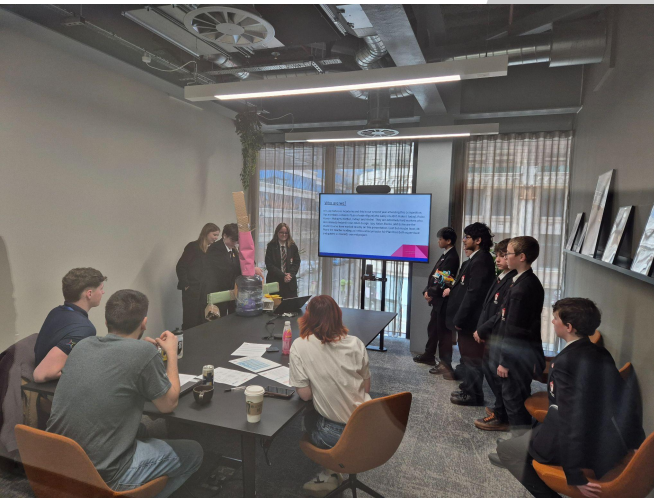

- Best Actress in a Musical: Lily**

The next thing is to wonder *What's the buzz* for next year's production!!

Hall Cross Academy: Les Misérables - a show with beautiful poignancy

As an NSTA representative, it was an honour for me to visit Hall Cross Academy for their production of *Les Misérables* on Wednesday 26th February 2025, as the musical celebrates its 40th anniversary. *Les Misérables* has been a firm favourite with UK theatre-goers since it opened in London in 1985. Well over 100 students, teachers and wider members of the Hall Cross community were involved in this production, led by Head of Performing Arts Mike Dougherty.

Jean Valjean (played with passion and power by Ben) has been imprisoned for 19 years for stealing a loaf of bread to feed his sister's child. His nemesis, prison guard Javert (played with strong and stern subtlety by Lily) finally releases him. But when Valjean breaks his parole, Javert will pursue him relentlessly across 17 years and the whole of France and through a revolution.

The entire cast quickly filled the hall, as prisoners on a chain gang in early 19th-century France. Tied together with heavy ropes around their necks, and costumed strikingly in ripped shirts, some of the 46 actor-singers broke imaginary rocks on stage, whilst others hacked the walls down each side of the hall. On the balcony, 17 instrumentalists under the expert direction of Sarah Jones completed a thrilling "surround sound" experience. The musical pain in the pounding brass (including student Imogen on trombone), plangent winds (including Zoe and Lottie) and resonating strings (with Harry on bass guitar) sent a chill right through my body.

An early highlight was Valjean's solo "Who am I?", where Ben spent three captivating minutes alone on stage. On one side, he sang compellingly of his duty to God and the truth. On the other, he explored his concern for the workers and townspeople he now cares for and protects as mayor of Montreuil-sur-mer. A clever reprise of a single stark followspot (and the addition of a beautiful starcloth) linked Valjean's contemplation of justice to Javert's. Javert's song 'Stars' is normally sung high in a male baritone's voice, but this was low in Lily's rich contralto. As a result, her chilling determination and resolute certainty was combined with a revelatory softer side. Lily could "belt" her way through any great musical theatre role, but is also "one to watch" as a potential future star of operatic and classical repertoire by Wagner or Mahler. Late in the show, Ben's 'Bring Him Home' brought the house down, also revealing a softer side to his character. With a masterful *voix mixte*, he proved a great actor can move an audience most when sitting still, offering the audience an irresistible invitation to enter into his internal world.

'I Dreamed a Dream' is a soliloquy of huge scope, as Fantine's life takes a soon-to-be-fatal turn for the worse. Maddie made a wonderful choice to relive her fading memories of happiness one last time in a radiantly subtle first verse. "But" - with a dark turn and sudden sadness - "the tigers come at night ... and turn your dream to shame", Maddie's shocking gasp and chilling distress here (backed again by exceptional brass playing) was a highlight of the evening.

After so much pain and suffering, innkeeper Thénardier (played by a sly and spritely Jack) and his wife (brought to life by a terrifyingly funny Malwina) provided welcome comic relief. Leading a raucous ensemble of travellers, townspeople and drunks in 'Master of the House', their mastery of bold physical and vocal comedy honoured the showstopping theatricality that has defined this pair on stage. But, contrasting with the soulful goodness of Ben's Valjean, and the lawful wrong of Lily's Javert, Jack and Malwina also showed us some of the nihilistic evil that completes the key moral triangle at the heart of Victor Hugo's novel.

Moving on to Paris in 1832, 'In My Life' is a beautiful 'triple soliloquy'. Carrie (as Cosette) sang and acted the extended opening to this number with such breathtaking beauty that it fully justified the way that Isaac (as Marius) completely ignored the competing charms of Gracie (as Eponine). Another great success for this production, in a notoriously tricky part of the show even for professional casts!

Enjolras's passion is for the plight of the people, rather than romance. Lois acted this role with clarity, strength and kindness as the visionary leader. Leading the full ensemble of students and revolutionaries against Javert's army and police at the barricades, she was assisted by excellent and complex movement work (including an ambitious stunt fall during the first attack).

Les Misérables features hundreds of characters, with each ensemble member taking on several roles over the evening. Some have only a few minutes to make their presence felt, and special mention must be made of Aina's Bishop of Digne. Early in the show, her profound spiritual warmth and deeply human hope released Ben to go on Valjean's epic journey.

Beyond the cast performances, Nifemi, Jia and Parker did an exceptional job stage managing slick scene changes, and rapid entries and exits by the huge cast. Cath Crowther, assisted by dance captains Jasmine and Hannah, choreographed several wonderful dance numbers, and no doubt were key players in the complex choral movement throughout the show. Dylan's virtuosic lighting used rapid cues to vividly conjure up a night of gunfire, chaos and jeopardy, taking the hall's capable rig to its absolute max. Dylan was one of several alumni from Hall Cross's ICA-Perform programme who returned to contribute their skills and experience to the show, underlining the great strengths of Mr Dougherty and his team's aims to "Imagine, Create, Achieve". Joined by Charlie Lytle and Steve Buckley (live mixing over 30 channels of vocal and orchestral microphones), the show was a technical triumph.

I was delighted on numerous occasions by hugely original choices, creating a *Les Misérables* unique to Hall Cross. Of these, the final wedding scene featuring Marius, Cosette and the Thénardiens was a particular triumph. Perhaps the most strikingly original moment for me was when a quartet of younger ensemble members mourned their older friends who had fallen at the barricades. "Turning, turning, turning through the years," they sang with beautiful poignancy, representing the next generation of Hall Cross talent. Older ensemble members joined them, turning "minutes into hours and the hours into years". Soon the whole company – cast, orchestra, stage managers, technical and production team – were recognised in a well-deserved standing ovation from an enraptured audience. The cast had sung that "Nothing changes. Nothing ever can." But this is *Les Misérables'* clever dramatic lie: we can change the world! Exceptional theatre, produced and performed by great young ensembles like this one at Hall Cross Academy, is one very important way to "be the change we wish to see". Bravo! I can't wait to see your next show...

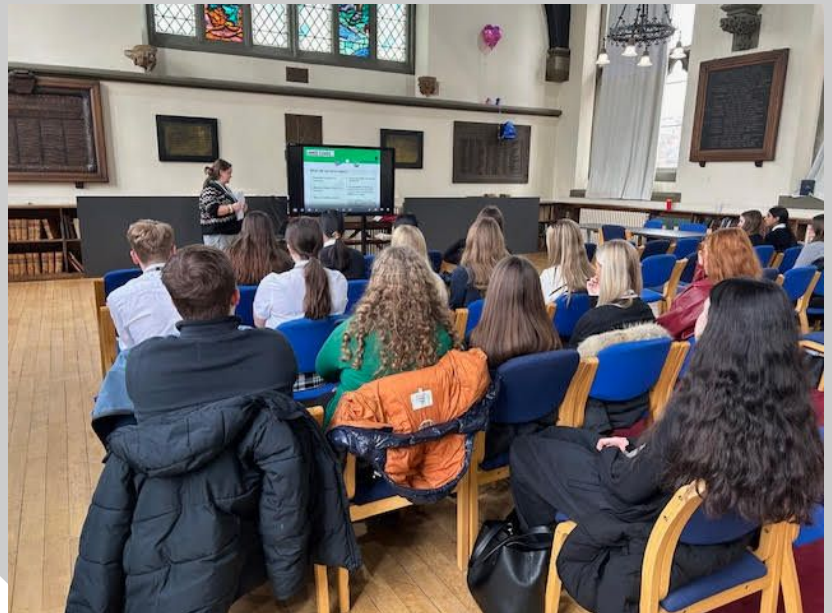

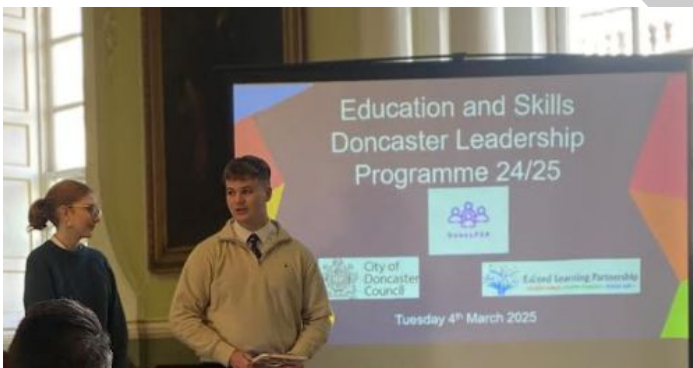
